Pre Camp Preparation

Please make sure that your child is fit and ready to begin their course when they come to camp.

ENGLISH ASSESSMENT

If your child is taking English classes, two weeks prior to your child's arrival at camp, he/she will be required to undertake an online English assessment in order to accurately assess his/her level of English when he/she starts camp. This will enable us to plan effective groups.

Details of this assessment will be sent to you just prior to that time.

Should you have any questions or require any further information in the meantime, please do not hesitate to contact us.

WHAT TO BRING

Clothing

Students will need to wear clothing suitable for performing their chosen sport, eg. trainers, shorts, t-shirts, protective gear, etc as well as general sports clothes. In their free time, especially evenings, students are free to wear what they like. It is advisable to bring waterproof clothing and something warm as well as summer clothes. All clothes should be machine washable and suitable for tumble driers and **clearly marked with your child's name.**

Laundry

If your child is staying for one week then they will need to bring about 7 days' worth of clothing. If he/she is are staying for more than one week then we offer a free laundry service every week. Clothes will be collected, washed, dried and returned approximately 2 days later as long as they are marked with your child's name.

Toiletries

Your child will need a small bag containing personal toiletries. We recommend that these are also marked with your child's name.

Sports Equipment

If your child is doing a sports course then we do recommend that they bring their own sports equipment.

Please make sure that the item is well packed with plenty of protective covering to ensure that it arrives and returns in good condition. **All sports equipment (case included) must be clearly marked with your child's name.**

We do have a limited supply of sports equipment at camp for those trying a sport for the first time or those who have problems carrying or bringing their own things with them.

Exsportise Insurance only covers one item of personal belonging up to the value of £200. Please make sure you take out extra insurance if your child's sport equipment is of greater value than this!

Electronic Devices & Valuable

Your child might want to bring valuable

items to camp like iPods, tablets, phones,

cameras etc. We recommend they hand

them in to the Centre Manager or Centre

Administrator on arrival for safe-keeping.

Items

Passports, Tickets & Pocket Money

We recommend that your child brings a small amount of pocket money for souvenirs, snacks and incidental shopping. Children staying for more than a week will go on at least two excursions, and will also enjoy a programme of evening entertainment, which may be off site for older children.

All passports, tickets and pocket money will be kept by the Centre Manager or Centre Administrator for safekeeping.

Below is a guide as to how much pocket money you should give your child. PLEASE DO NOT GIVE YOUR CHILD EUROS OR ANY OTHER CURRENCIES. THERE ARE NO EXCHANGE FACILITIES AVAILABLE. All pocket money should be in British Pounds Sterling.
